Downloading Media Elements From the Internet

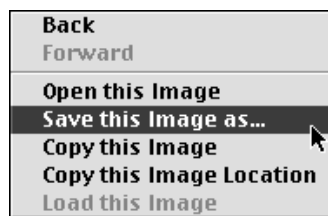
Downloading sounds, movies, photographs, and clip art from the Internet is very easy. You simply select the item you want and save it. Sounds, movies, photographs, and clip art are all saved in the same manner. This step-by-step card describes how to download from the Internet with Netscape Navigator.

Downloading Internet resources with Netscape Navigator

Note: These steps assume you are connected to the World Wide Web via Netscape Navigator and have located a media element to download.

- 1 Position the pointer on the item you want to save and hold down the mouse button.

A pop-up menu appears.



- 2 Choose "Save this Image as" from the pop-up menu.

A Save dialog box appears.

- 3 Type the name of the item, select where you want the item saved, and click Save.

To use many of the sounds and movies found on the Internet, you need to have the correct plug-in. A plug-in is an external program that allows many multimedia elements, such as audio, animation, video, and other types of Web page effects, to play on the Internet. Many browsers have built-in plug-ins. If you move the saved item to a computer without the plug-in, it may not play.
